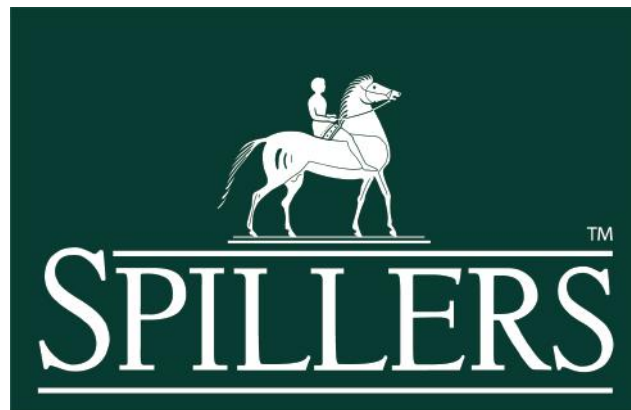

CLASS 1: Maximum Height 70cms* (Restricted to riders aged 14 years and under on 1 January 2023).

CLASS 2: Maximum Height 80cms*.

CLASS 3: Maximum Height 90cms*.

*To be run as a Single Phase Competition – see below.

Points Accumulator for the £500 Training Bursary sponsored by Spillers.

Points are awarded in each class from 6 points to 1st place, down to 1 point for 6th Place. Dependent on entries each class may be split into two or more sections. Rosettes and points will be awarded to Teams placed from 1st to 6th in each section. In the event of two or more Teams from the **same** Branch gaining points in the same class height, only the points obtained by the higher placed team in that class will count towards the Branch total. The points from the other Team will then pass down to the next highest place team in their section.

In the event of equality of points the Bursary will be awarded to the Branch jumping the greater number of clear rounds. If these are the same the branch with the highest placed team in Class 3 will be awarded the bursary.

The competition will run under Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2023, Speed 325 m/min. except as modified below:

This will be run as a single-phase competition. Each team member will jump the first part of the course then, if not eliminated, will continue straight to the second part of the course which will be timed, and which may include some fences raised to a maximum of 5cms above the advertised class height. The best three scores to count. Jumping faults from part one of the course will be carried forward to part two. In the event of equality of jumping faults, team places will be decided by taking the aggregate time for the three team members with the lowest jumping faults. Eliminated competitors will take the worst score for the round, plus 20 faults.

Entries:

- The Entry fee is £90 per team per class, which includes £8 team contribution towards paramedic costs. All costs include VAT at the prevailing rate.
- The Entry fee includes entry for lorries/trailers & their occupants. Each team will be issued with one complimentary entry ticket for the Team Trainer/Manager or DC which will be sent by email. This will allow the ticket holder free entry and parking in the visitor car park only.
- Accompanying vehicles will be charged at the gate price. Tickets can be purchased online in advance at www.rockinghamcastlehorsetrials.com.
- No accompanying vehicles are allowed in the Lorry/Trailer Park.
- Entries to be made via www.horse-events.co.uk.
- Entries will be limited and taken on a first come first served basis. A waitlist will be in operation.
- Branches may enter a maximum of two teams per Class.
- Riders and horses/ponies need to be named when the entry is made.
- Entries close Thursday 27 April 2023 or earlier if oversubscribed.
- If a substitution of a horse and/or rider is required, this must be declared at the competition prior to the start of the class in the Pony Club Secretary's tent.
- Start times and numbers for each section will be available from 18.00hrs on Tuesday 16 May 2023 from www.ponyclubresults.co.uk
- Please print your own number 3 times, 2 to wear in your number bib and 1 to display in your vehicle on arrival. The number must be displayed in your vehicle at all times.
- **Withdrawals** by email to horsetrials@rockinghamcastle.com **must be** made by Friday 5 May 2023 at 12.00hrs. All entries before this date will be issued with a full refund minus £10.00 admin fee. Withdrawals after 12.01hrs on 5 May 2023 are non-refundable.

Results & Prize Giving

- Team results will be published on www.ponyclubresults.co.uk.
- Training Bursary results will be available in the Pony Club Secretary's tent.
- Prize Giving's will be presented on the prize giving podium next to the Bar tent approximately 30 minutes following the end of the class.
- Rosettes to 10th place and sashes to the winning team in each Section.
- Spillers Training Bursary to be awarded to the winning branch following the Class 3 prize giving.

Terms and Conditions:

1. Teams to consist of 3 or 4 current Pony Club members aged 25 years and under except Class 1 only, age 14 and under. Only one rider over the age of 20 is permitted per team in Classes 2 and 3. Riders can only take part once in each class and in not more than two classes.
All ages to be taken on 1 January 2023.
2. The following are not eligible to take part: Combination of horse/pony and rider who have competed at the Pony Club PC100 Show Jumping Championships, and/ or at the PC110 Show Jumping or Eventing Area Competition and above.
3. Horses/ponies can only take part once in each class and in not more than two classes.
4. No horse/pony under 5 years of age is eligible. Stallions can only be ridden by members if they have obtained written permission from their District Commissioner/Centre Proprietor and in the interests of safety, must wear identifying discs on their bridle.
5. Vaccinations must be up to date and in line with British Eventing & FEI rules. As per BE rule 10.2 – 10.3 an initial course of two primary vaccinations, not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days apart, are required before being eligible to compete.
A first booster injection must be given within seven months after the date of administration of the second primary dose with at least annual boosters given subsequently.
The most recent booster injection must have been given within the six calendar months and 21 days prior to the horse/pony arriving at the competition. A horse/pony may not compete if it has been given an injection on any of the 7 days before the event.
6. Passports should be made available if requested; we reserve the right to carry out spot checks of passports on the day.
7. Protests or objections must be made by the Team Manager/Trainer to the Secretary, not later than 30 minutes after the happening or 20 minutes after the scores have been published. Objections/protests must be accompanied by a £25.00 fee.
8. The Judge's decision is final. The Judge reserves the right to disqualify any rider at any stage of the competition for dangerous riding, inappropriate behaviour, misuse of whip or spurs, ill treatment of the horse or if in their opinion the horse is lame, sick or exhausted.
9. The Organisers of the Rockingham International Horse Trials reserve the right to make any changes and/or amendments to the competition and/or rules.
10. Paramedics and Vet will be in attendance.
11. All competitors, when mounted, **must** use designated horse walks. It is the responsibility of the team manager/trainer to make all their competitors aware of the locations of the horse walks, warm up and arenas. Please ask all competitors to follow the maps provided prior to the competition and onsite directional signage.

Other Notices

Estate Rules:

- Rockingham Castle Estate is a heritage site, please respect this.
- All dogs must be kept on leads and under control. Please bag and bin dog waste.
- No horses/ponies may be left outside lorries/trailers unattended.
- No hay nets may be tied to the outside lorries/trailers.
- All droppings must be removed from the lorry park before departure.
- When mounted, all competitors must use the designated Horse Walks; failure to do so may result in elimination.
- Please take your rubbish home.

Access – please allow plenty of time to arrive as a one-way system to the site will be in operation.

No accompanying cars allowed in Lorry Park, please follow signs for the Visitor Car Park.
